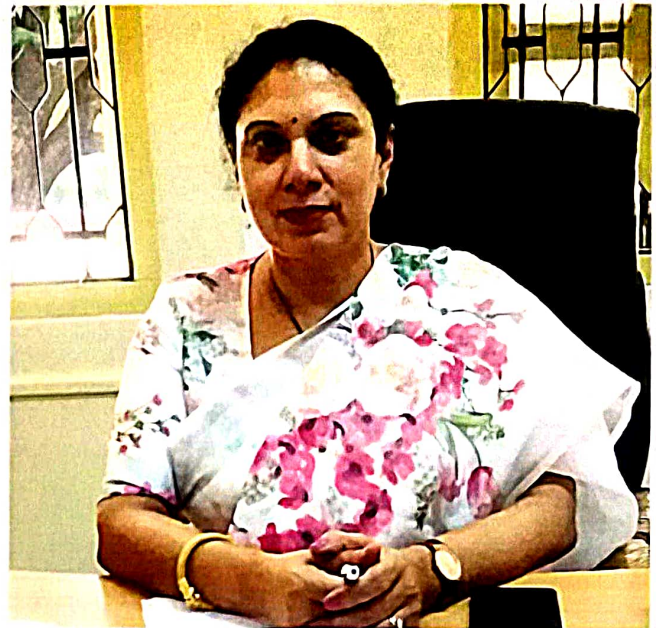

Informative assembly conducted by: Department of Physics and Electronics

The Resonance club of Physics and Electronics department conducted an assembly session on the success of Chandrayaan-3 on 25/09/2023. The session began with the National song Vande Mataram followed by the thought of the day and then the news. The student quoted the words of Conard Hilton: "Success seems to be connected with action. Successful people keep moving. They make mistakes but they don't quit", relating it with the theme of the session.

The students of B.Sc Physical Sciences highlighted the reasons for the success of Chandrayaan-3 along with the details of ISRO's 'Chandrayaan' program. The students explained the techniques used to make Chandrayaan-3's lander land safely and softly on the south pole of the lunar surface and the improvements made by the ISRO as compared to the Chandrayaan-2 mission.

The students also highlighted the important timestamps of lunar orbit insertion and landing and also about the declaration of August 23rd as National Space Day. The students also mentioned the team behind the success of Chandrayaan-3.

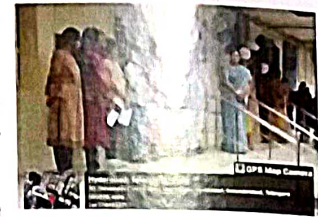
The students also presented a comparison between ISRO's Chandrayaan-3 and ROSCOSMOS' Luna-25 highlighting the reasons for crash landing of Luna-25. The assembly was concluded with the National Anthem.

On 22 July 2019, ISRO launched Chandrayaan-2 on board a Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM3) launch vehicle consisting of an orbiter, a lander and a rover.

The lander was scheduled to touch down on the lunar surface on 6 September 2019 to deploy the Pragyan rover.

The lander lost contact with mission control, deviated from its intended trajectory while attempting to land near the lunar south pole, and crash.

The lunar south pole region holds particular interest for scientific exploration. Studies show large amounts of ice there. Mountainous terrain and unpredictable lighting protect the ice from melting, but they also make landing scientific probes there a challenging undertaking. The ice could contain solid-state compounds that would normally melt under warmer conditions elsewhere on the Moon — compounds which could provide insight into lunar, Earth, and Solar System history.



The successful launch of Aditya L1 marks a new chapter in India's space exploration journey, with Nigar Shaji leading the way. As the project director, her leadership and expertise have been instrumental in realizing this mission.

Aditya L1 shall be the first space based Indian mission to study the Sun. The spacecraft shall be placed in a halo orbit around the Lagrange point 1 (L1) of the Sun-Earth system, which is about 1.5 million km from the Earth.

A satellite placed in the halo orbit around the L1 point has the major advantage of continuously viewing the Sun without any occultation/eclipses. This will provide a greater advantage of observing the solar activities and its effect on space weather in real time.

As the discourse continued, the audience gained insights into the significance of Hindi. Some remarkable points were:



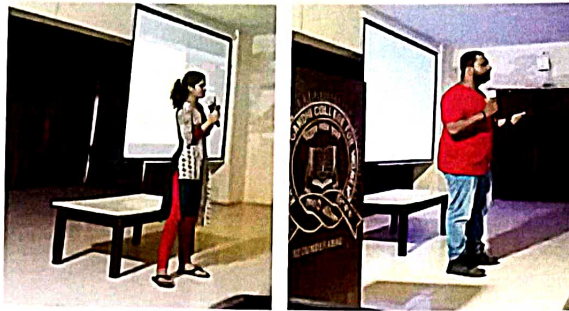
- **Hindi's Popularity:** It ranks as the third most spoken language globally in terms of native speakers and population, serving as a unifying link language.
